## A message from GM Joe Mendoza - NEW STREET SWEEPING SCHEDULE

The Rossmoor Community Services District Board of Directors is excited to announce a new street sweeping schedule based on odd and even addresses.

After decades of not having parking alternatives because of street sweeping occurring on all streets on one day, the new agreement with OC Public Works will provide parking alternatives on opposite sides of the streets on street sweeping days. See the schedule below and map on page 2.

The RCSD Board of Directors has worked diligently to find a

solution to ongoing complaints from residents not having a place to park on street sweeping days and being subject to tickets and fines when in violation.

Under the new street sweeping schedule, residents will continue to be subject to tickets when in violation, however, the new schedule provides an alternative to having to park in retail areas, on lawns, and in driveway aprons. Residents will have alternative parking available within walking distance of their homes, enhancing the community's quality of life.

The new schedule will begin in January. Warning citations will be provided, with the new program going live in February.

The RCSD Board of Directors gives special thanks to OC Second District Supervisor Katrina Foley and OC Public Works for working with RCSD to find this solution.

The new schedule will be conveyed through signage, newspaper articles, door hangers, a town hall meeting, and banners. Residents are encouraged to share the information with their neighbors. RCSD appreciates the patience of residents as the new street sweeping schedule is implemented.

A new vendor contract will be awarded by the RCSD Board of Directors at its meeting on Tuesday, December 14. For more information, call the RCSD Office at (562) 430-3707. ■

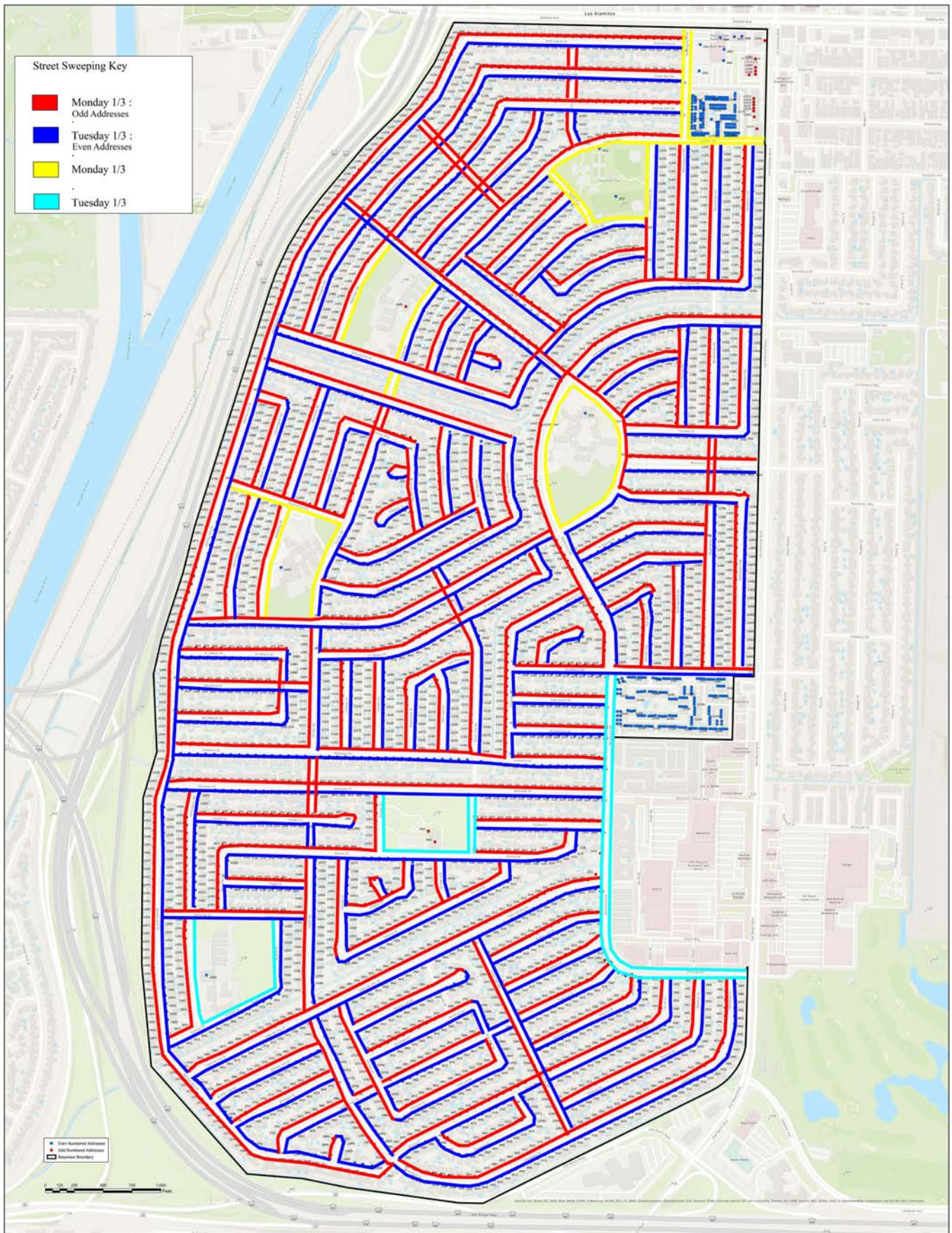

## CR&R Community Town Hall to be held on December 4

CR&R will hold a Community Town Hall meeting on Saturday, December 4 from 10 to 11 a.m. at the Rossmoor Community Auditorium located at Rush Park (3001 Blume Drive) in Rossmoor.

Information will be provided about the upcoming Source Separated Organics and Food Scrap Recycling as mandated by state law beginning in January 2022. Other topics to be discussed include service reminders and information about bulky item collections, annual clean up and shred events, and best practices for your recycling program.

## Los Alamitos Trunk Sewer project continues to make progress

Construction on the Los Alamitos Trunk Sewer Project by the Orange County Sanitation District (OC San) continues to make progress. This project is making improvements to two parallel sewer lines and associated manholes on Los Alamitos Boulevard and Katella Avenue.

Work on Lexington Drive from Corporate Center Drive to Katella Avenue and Katella Avenue from Lexington Drive to Los Alamitos Boulevard is ongoing and will be completed in the next couple of months.

Crews are now moving to Los Alamitos Boulevard, which involves cleaning of the pipe followed by inspection and grouting of the

pipe joints. Once this work is complete, manhole repair work will begin after the new year. During this phase, work will only occur on the northbound side of the street. Phase two will occur on the southbound lanes and commence in Summer 2022.

All cleaning and grouting must occur at night when flow in the sewer pipes is lower. Manhole work will vary between day and night to address both residential and commercial areas on the street.

The first phase of work will take place from December through Spring 2022. Line cleaning will take place Sunday through Friday from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Manhole construction work will take place

Sunday through Friday from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. and Monday through Saturday from 8:30 a.m. to 9 p.m.; this is based on location. Specifics can be found on the project website at [ocsan.gov/losalamitos](http://ocsan.gov/losalamitos).

The community should expect the following:

- Northbound lane closures
- Potential temporary bus stop relocations for northbound routes at Farquhar Avenue, Orangewood Avenue, and Rossmoor Way
- Street parking restrictions
- Occasional crosswalk closures
- Occasional turn restrictions
- Increased noise
- Access to all business and homes will be maintained ■

The RCSD would like to remind residents that unauthorized tree trimming is prohibited and will result in a citation and fine of at least \$300. Property owners have the option to apply for a permit to have their own contractor trim parkway trees.
